1. Titus Moms, read Psalm 8 out loud.
2. In verse 2, David says, “When I consider Your heavens ...,” it’s not an “if” statement, it’s a “when” statement. Because David was a shepherd as a young man, he spent time looking at the night sky ... no artificial lights. However, he still *considered* (pondered, reflected, thought deeply about) the heavens. Have you considered the heavens? Have you ever been out on a clear night, unencumbered by artificial lights, and considered the heavens? What does this do in your soul? Do you become overwhelmed with the greatness of God and the smallness of yourself?
3. As you heard God’s Word today, what is the one thing that stands out the most to you?
4. My prayer is that God showed Himself, through His Word to be majestic to you. He is glorious. He is worthy to be praised. He shows us Christ and His redemptive plan through this Psalm.
5. Titus Moms, with your women, close in prayer by praying this Psalm to the Lord. If your women want to participate, you can go around the room and have each woman read one of the verses as a prayer to the Lord.
6. Take time tonight or this weekend to find a place away from artificial lights and stare into the night sky – either alone or with your husband and children or with a friend ... and consider the heavens. Ask God to reveal His majesty, His strength, His creation, and His redemptive plan for you ...
